Activity : Rain Water Harvesting Survey
Objective of the activity : To conduct survey and spread awareness regarding 'Rain Water Harvesting'.

Agenda of the activity:

- To gather information regarding all the types of rain water harvesting systems used in various buildings, schools, colleges, industries, residential or housing societies, etc. in various areas of Bhiwandi.
- To interact spread awareness among the people in order to discuss the importance of the rain water harvesting.
- To collect data and analyze the same in order to have a base for the future projects or activities related to various purposes of rain water harvesting.
- To enhance the communication skills, build confidence and boost morale of the volunteers.

Execution:

On 2nd August, 2018, the NSS volunteers of Shree Halari Visa Oswal College of Commerce conducted a survey on 'Rain Water Harvesting' in various areas throughout Bhiwandi. The volunteers form 4 groups with each group containing 4 to 6 volunteers. The survey began at 10:30 a.m. with proper questioner containing details of survey to be conducted in specific areas and lasted for 2 hours and 30 minutes covering many areas in different sectors of Bhiwandi. The volunteers gathered the various information about various types of system installed by people and inquired about the type, cost, duration, technique, purpose of usage and benefits of the rain water harvesting systems and ensured that the same weather were installed in their respective buildings or units. A questionnaire was used as a survey tool by the volunteers which was aided them to collect and gather relevant information in an organized manner. The activity not only helped to collect data about the use of Rain Water Harvesting units but also brought volunteers closer to the people helping them communicate more openly.
